

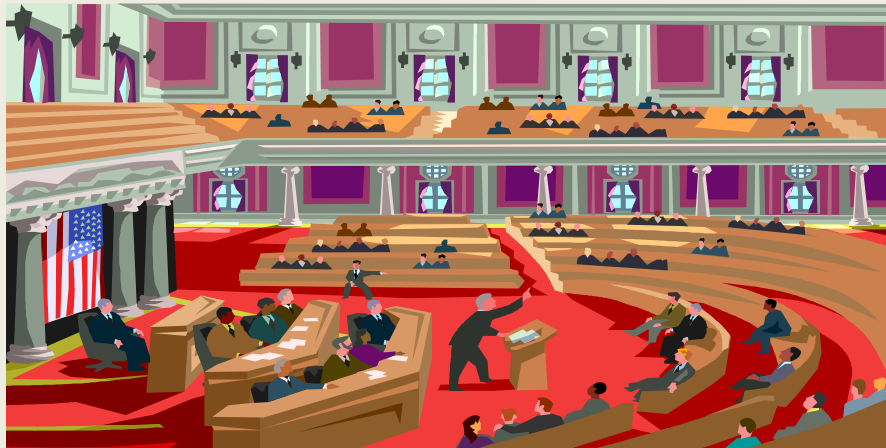

The 2021/2022 Legislature

- Senate: 32(R) – 3(D)
- House: 62(R) – 8(D)
- Total: 94 (R) – 11(D)

- **Women = 30**
 - Senate – 9
 - House - 21



The Session: By the numbers

- Senate **213** bills **3** SJR **216** – total
- House **340** bills **3** HJR **343** – total
- Totals **553** **6** **559**

Vetoes

- **SB 76** – Lottery Prize Money/Debts (Feb)
- **HB 1223** – Informed Consent Preg. Minors
- **SB 151** – Removal of Marijuana Convictions Background Checks
- **HB 1281** – Legislative Control of Federal Funds
 - \$100 Million for Daycare
 - Debate on what money was involve
 - Override vote had 40 votes



Good Stuff

- **\$600 Million: Water/Wastewater/Storm/Nonpoint**
 - SB 62 – Dept. of Ag and Natural Resources
- **6% increase: Providers/Schools/St Employees**
 - Add \$100+ to base budget
- **Technical Colleges**
 - Manufacturing Simulators Lake Area Tech
 - Medical Simulators – South East Technical
- **Cyber Security** – DSU/Sioux Falls
- **Discovery District** – USD/Sioux Falls
- **Research** - School of Mines
- **West River Health Science Center**
- **Quiet Zones** – Class 1 Cities

Workforce Housing

- **Governor proposed \$200 Million**
 - Grants thru GOED
 - Leveraged = 1/3rd state; 1/3rd local; 1/3rd developer
- **SB 53 & SB 65**
 - SB 53 – passed the House
 - SB 65 – failed three times (kept getting 45/46 votes)
- **HB 1033 - Hoghoused**
 - \$200 Million – SD Housing Devel. Authority



\$200 Million Workforce Housing

- **\$100 million is for revolving loans**
- **\$100 million is for Grants**
 - The grants cannot be more than 1/3rd
 - The other 2/3rd are not specified
- **All funds to be used for infrastructure**
- **30% reserved communities populations >than 50K**
 - Sioux Falls and Rapid City
- **70% for the rest of the communities**



\$200 Million Workforce Housing

- **Communities populations >50K (Rapid & Sioux Falls)**
 - use one of the programs above.
- **Communities with populations < than 50K**
 - both grants and loans for projects.
- **Many details to be determined by the Housing Authority**
- **The rule making process of the Authority**
 - does not have the same open process as other executive departments of state government.

More on Workforce Housing

- **SB 90 – Sen. Otten (R-Lennox)**
 - Building Codes – Local flexibility state code of 2021, preemption on residential sprinklers
- **SB 162 – Sen. Crabtree (R-Madison)**
 - revise the discretionary formula, reduce tax of new structures/residential property.
 - 25% (1&2); 50% (3&4); 75% (5&6); 100% (7)
 - Year of construction value = year prior.

COVID – Six Bills

Including SB 211

- **Most Dealing With**
 - Protecting from penalty not getting vaccinated
 - Allow UI/RA if fired for not getting vaccinated
 - Allow conscience objections
- **HB 1008 – Causes of Action**
- **SB 211 – Required Three Exemptions**
 - Medical
 - Religious (close to conscience)
 - Antibodies – Having had COVID
 - Hoghoused – other ideas above – Killed Conference Cmte

Marijuana

- **49 Bills (Subject Index)**
 - 18 – House
 - 31 – Senate
- **Definitions; Taxation; Plants; Medical**
- **Focus = Employer Concerns – No Bills**
 - Fire for THC tests
 - Not hire if THC tests



Medicaid Expansion

Senator Steinhauer (R-Hartford)

- **SB 186 - expand Medicaid by the Legislature**
 - Doesn't belong in Constitution
 - Passed Health & Human Services – 4-Yea to 3-Nay
 - Lost to Full Senate by 12-Yea to 23-Nay
- **SB 102 – Medicaid Expansion Fund**
 - Passed Senate – 21-Yea to 14-Nay
 - Tabled in House Appropriations – 7-Yea to 1 Nay

Medicaid Expansion



- **Ballot for the November General Election**
 - Amendment D
- **June Primary Election**
 - Amendment C
 - Increase vote for Medicaid Expansion to 60%.
 - Subject to legal challenge – Multiple Subjects
 - Owen is plaintiff acting in personal capacity

Odds and Ends

- **SB 46 – Women’s Sports – Transgender**
- **SB 182 – Bank Policy Regarding 2nd Amendment**
 - State/Subdivisions not do business with banks not financing gun mfg/ammunition/gun stores.
 - NRA backed legislation
- **SB 80 – Electricity Into Cars NOT Utility**
 - PUC will not need to regulate charging stations
- **Tax Reductions**
 - Repeal Half Penny/ Remove Food (passed House)

More Odd than End

- **SB 70 – Modify time to report Work Comp Injury**
 - Currently 3 days; bill sought 30 days
- **Property Taxes – Ag Issues Crop Up Again**
 - HB 1039 – Crop/Non-Crop
 - Added an element of altitude – 1,950 ft
 - Fiscal note = \$12 million
- **HB 1325 – classification of land by soil type**
 - Class 1-3 = crop; class 5-8 = non-crop
 - Class 4 = either – notify department
 - Class 4 non-crop cannot grow > 20%/yr
