



COVID-19: Manufacturing Business Checklist

ENTRY TO/EXIT FROM BUILDING

- Schedule work shifts to reduce congregate settings and improve social distancing (i.e. stagger start and end times so all employees are not arriving and/or leaving at the same time)
- Install additional time clocks to prevent bottlenecks (*if applicable*)
- Hand sanitizer at entrances/exits

PERSONNEL SCREENING

- Pre-screen employees for fever and other symptoms prior to employees entering building
- Screen visitors to building

ENGINEERING CONTROLS

- Handwashing stations/hand sanitizers at every potential point of contact
- If fans are used in facility, blow clean air toward employees' breathing zone
- Install high-efficiency air filters and increase ventilation rates in the work environment

EMPLOYEE TRAINING AND EDUCATION

- COVID safety training, presentation, or information shared (in all common languages used by workers)
- Posters/signs put up to encourage frequent and proper handwashing (in all common languages used by workers)

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT MEASURES

- Provide personal protective equipment (PPE) based on the hazard to worker (*if applicable*)
- PPE is properly fitted and periodically refitted, as applicable; regularly inspected, maintained, and replaced as necessary
- Train workers who use personal protective equipment how to properly put it on, use/wear, remove, clean and store to avoid contamination of self, others, and environment

ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROLS AND WORK PRACTICES

- All non-essential meetings, huddles, conferences cancelled
- Stagger breaks to minimize intermingling of team members and/or expand break areas
- All non-necessary visitors not admitted to building
- Enhanced cleaning of all common areas, including additional downtime for fogging with a sanitizer as needed
- Publicly posted sick leave policy
- Specific procedures for disinfecting
- Physical 6-foot markings on ALL work benches/tables/conveyors/assembly lines for distance markers
- Modify workstations to minimize close contact between workers; install physical barriers (e.g., plastic sneeze guards) or ensure 6 feet or more between employees
- Reduce production line staffing to extent feasible to minimize close worker contact

EMPLOYEE SAFETY AND HEALTH

- Process for identifying and separating employees who become ill/symptomatic while at work
- Flexible leave policies to accommodate workers who are ill and make employees aware of policies
- Sick workers able to stay home without fear of reprisals
- Do not require a healthcare provider's note for employees who are sick with acute respiratory illness to validate their illness or return to work
